Here they combine business with pleasant relaxation and congenial companionship.

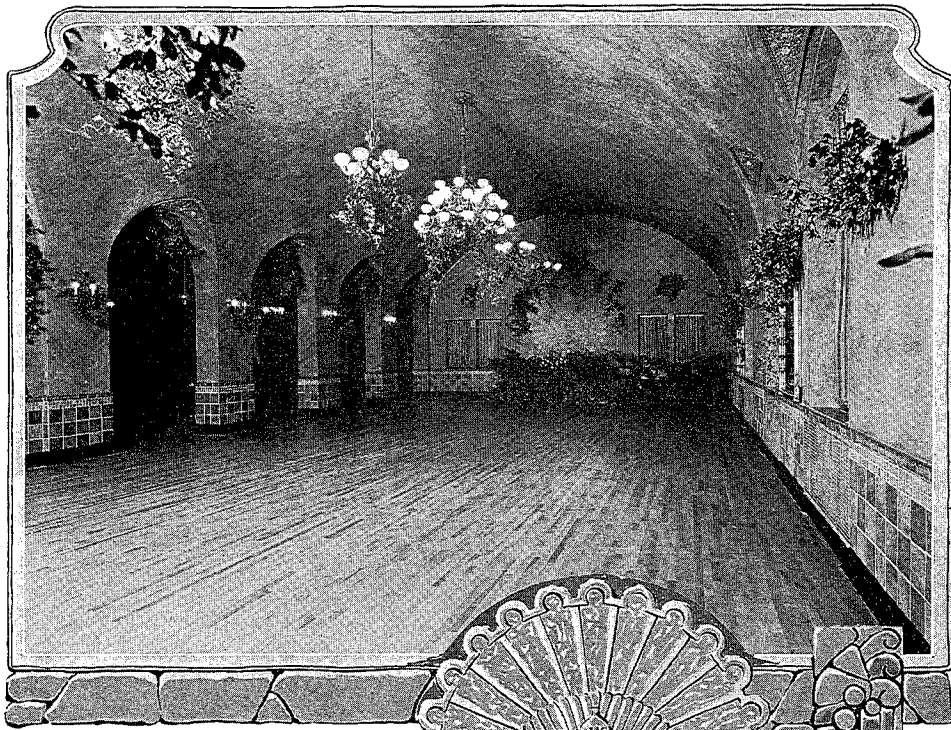


FANNED by cool, refreshing Gulf breezes,



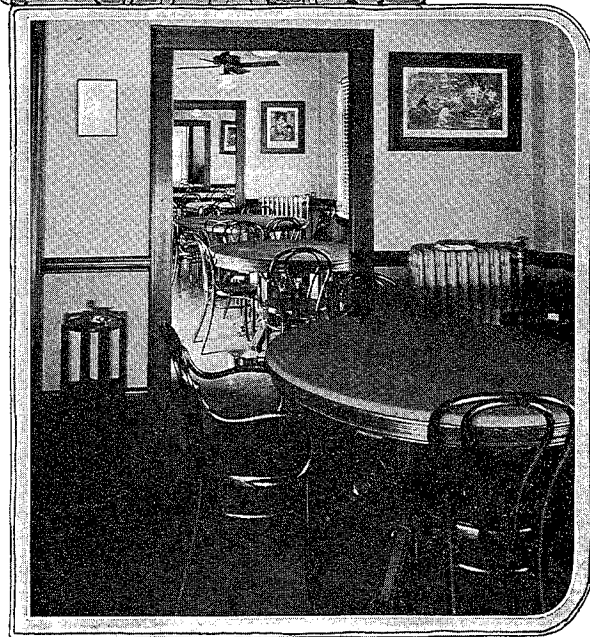

A huge fireplace, recalling the comforts and delights of pioneer days, with its gas log, irons and kettle, add to the attractiveness of the men's lounge.

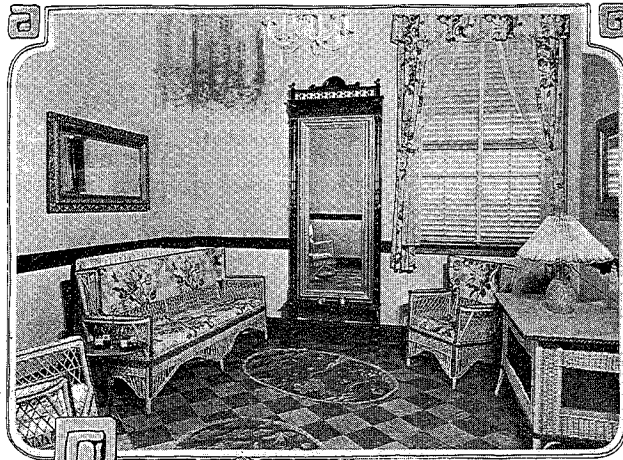

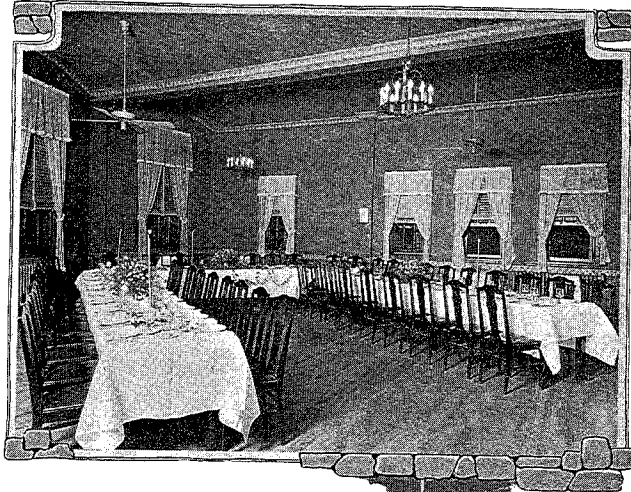
**A**MONG the impressive features will be found huge antique colonial mirrors that once adorned the Astor House in New York.

**A**N attractive section of the San Antonio-Casino Club is the men's lounge. Here our busy business men gather for relaxation and for business conferences.

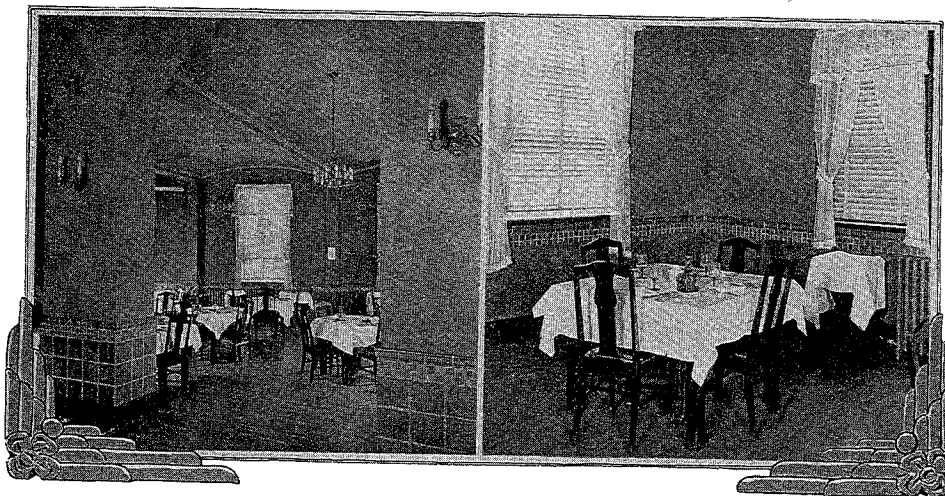
Comfortable conference rooms add to the facilities of the Club and a well equipped billiard room finds many devotees among Club members.



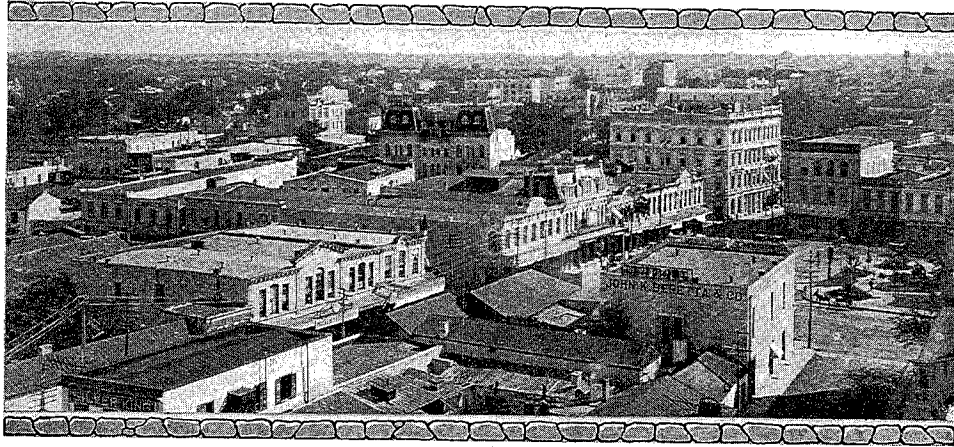

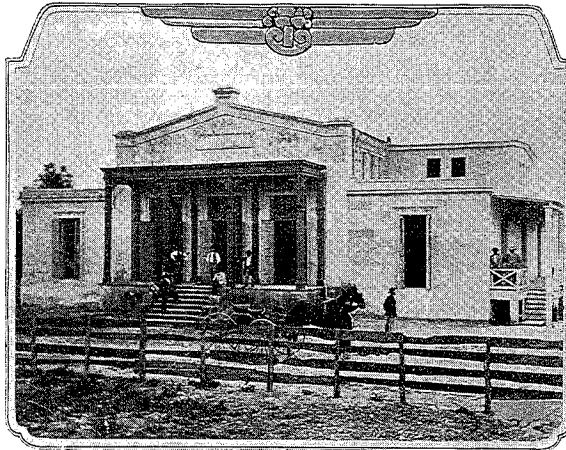

Just a Corner of the Dining Room

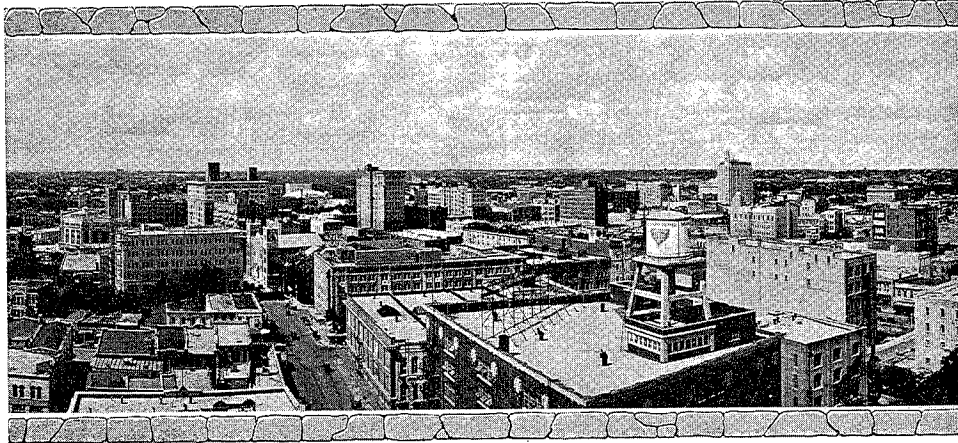

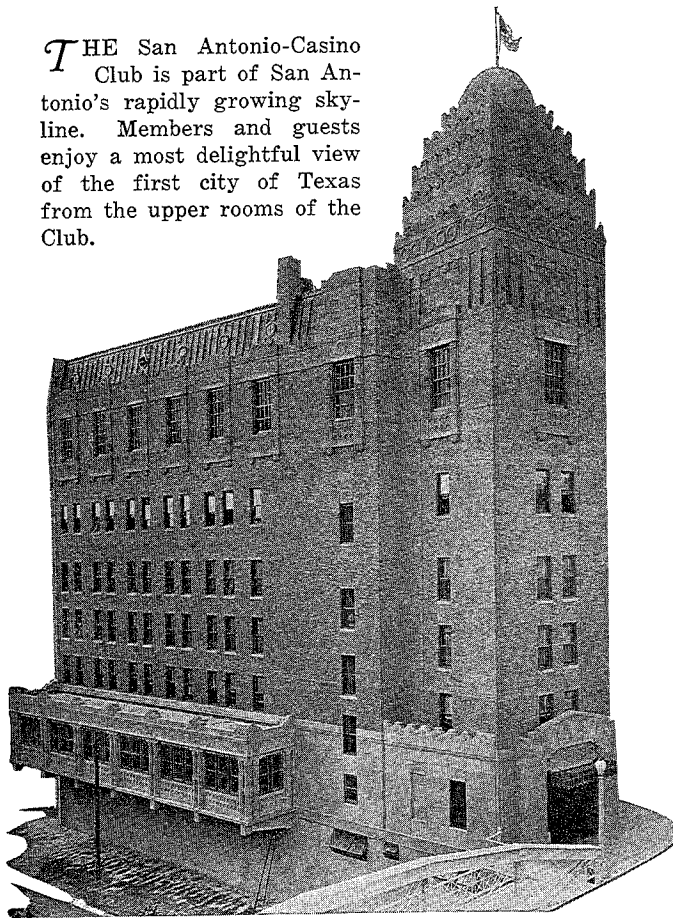
